I write to update you on The Royal Commission of Inquiry into Abuse in Care. The Royal Commission will conclude its Inquiry and present its Report to the Governor General later this month. As the Presbyterian Church has participated and cooperated fully with this Inquiry we will be included in the Report.

We now await the Report and recommendations and anticipate that the Commission's Report will not be an easy read as the Commission Chair states, "The whole country must pay attention when our final report is released and take responsibility to ensure that it never happens again".
